Dear Supporters and Partners of Springboard,

It is now 2 months we commenced the maiden edition (Oak Batch) of Springboard Entrepreneurship training. I will like to update you on our activities so far. In this Newsletter, I will introduce the Springboard participants to you, update you on the training and farm activities and share with you other exciting news and some challenges we have encountered in the last 2 months.

TRAINING SO FAR







Stage 1 (**Business Idea Development & Farm Adventure**) of the Springboard training is progressing well even though with some challenges encountered. Participants are happy to be learning new skills which will help them become self-employed and change agents in their communities. Presently, participants are very busy doing group work and at the same time writing their business plans. The stage 1 of the training will end during the first week of August 2013 with participants presenting their business ideas in front of a panel.

SPRINGBOARD 2013 PARTICIPANTS' PROFILE

2013 Springboard participants are very talented and full of potentials. Also, they demonstrate a huge readiness, tenacity and commitment towards learning how to turn their business ideas into successful businesses after graduating from the training.

At the start of the training in May 2013, we admitted 20 participants, 7 later dropped out of the training due to lack of money to transport themselves four times a week to the training centre and the farm. Most of our participants travel as far as 20km to attend the training. As much as we tried to get sponsorship to cover all participants' transport cost, we were only able to get for participants coming from Iju and Ita-ogbolu communities. The community leaders in these two communities, who see the potential impact Springboard has on their youth and the communities supported the participants from their villages with a token to cover their transport.





ANDRAS NEVAI, FROM HUNGARY, VISITS SPRINGBOARD IN AUGUST 2013





Springboard Farm












Igbatoro leaders donating farmland to Springboard

Activities on the Springboard farm are progressing with harvesting and sales of corn which we planted in March 2013. Also, Springboard participants, as part of their training, are taking part in these activities.

Good news! Igbatoro community (a village in Akure) has just donated (at no cost) some acres of farmland to Springboard. This donation has come at a time when some of our students will need farmland to start their farm projects after graduating from the training. Springboard will partner with its graduates who are starting farm projects by donating some of this farmland to them to commence their projects after graduating from the Springboard training in November 2013. Work has begun on the new farmland. By the end of July, we shall begin to plant plantain (local banana) suckers. We will not need to purchase suckers as we have enough on the present Springboard farm.
