1. ORGANIC FARM TRAINING/START-UP

In January 2017, we welcomed 50 new Young Farmers who are currently receiving training on organic farming and entrepreneurship. After they graduate from the training, they will set up Neighborhood Organic Farms (NOF) in Akure city. The idea of the NOF is to make organic farm closer to consumers in Akure City.

2. SEED CENTRE



In January/February 2017, we established a centre where our beneficiaries can nurse some seeds for sale. Our Students Farmers and Women Cooperatives have nursed seedlings in Cocoa, Dwarf Pawpaw, Mango, Cashew, Oranges, Coconut and Vegetables. It is already planting season and buyers have started patronizing the Seed Centre.







3. RURAL WOMEN ENTERPRISE COOPERATIVES

Empowering rural women enhances rural development and reduces poverty and rural-urban drift of youth. Springboard has 16 Women Cooperatives in 10 communities. During the 1st quarter of 2017, we recruited additional 50 women who are currently receiving training in small business. After the training, Springboard will support them to set up business cooperatives.

4. SPRINGBOARD PARTNERS WITH COMMUNITY TO ESTABLISH A SCHOOL

Springboard partnered with Ago Panu community, Akure, to establish a Nursery and Pry School for Farmers' children. The school was opened in January 2017 with 40 pupils.



5. SPRINGBOARD STARTS COCOA FARMING

We have nursed over 10,000 seedlings of cocoa to be planted at the Springboard farm in June 2017. Every year, we will keep planting additional 10,000 seedlings. After 4 years, we will begin to sell cocoa beans. Of course, we also have a goal to begin production of chocolate in future!
